

  - / After B.S. and church we all went to Mr. H. Chandler's for the afternoon. We all went in his waggon to the meeting at night. Ethel's birthday.
  - A wet dreary day. As I had some indoor work to do at Doongalla I went as usual. Sharp-ened & set a hand saw and started to make a sledge.
  - At Doongalla. Finished the sledge, placed stones in muddy holes worn by the horse near the old costage site, and set a large fire om a big stone in the kitchen garden in order break the stone below plow depth.
  - At Doongalla. Prepared to dig the triangle shrubbery but as Hodges was unable to work through having a sore eye I had to take his place with Fred Smale picking up and burn-ing logs & wood on the new clearing near the old pig-copper chimney.
  - At Doongalla. Finished picking up the main lot of logs & wood and started to prepare a very large log for charring. The log being up a steep bank from the fowl-yards we could not roll it into the creek without much cutting. At my suggestion Mr. Bex decided to try the charring. Fred Smale helped me.

- At Doongalla. Finished packing logs and set fire. Began to rake rubbish but had to stop at 3-30 on account of heavy rain. Sharpened the axe and began to level a sledge runner.
- 30 At Doongalla. RININKAMMINATING Finished clearing and levelled off lumps near the track.
- At Doon galla. Continued the digging in the three cornered shrubberyfor a little while while water supply dam & the settling tanks. I have a very heavy cold.
  - 2. At Doongalla. Digging. A foggy cold day.
  - At Doongalla. Digging. Still foggy and cold. Attended tennis club concert at night. Splendid affair. My cold is still very bad & I should not have gone at all.
  - At Doongalla. Finished digging and hoed off the rubbish above the shrubbery fence. At home in afternoon. Cleaning chimney etc.
  - The children and I attended B.S. and I stayed to church. Ethel, having a cold stayed at home with Nell. Lill, Mrs. Badger & Jessie came in afternoon. I went to the night meeting.
  - At Doongalla. I finished clearing away the rubbish I had hoed on Saturday, & in afternoon started making a flight of steps near the entrance to the little orchard. I
    attended for a little while at the night a social given by the church to say goodbye
    to Mr & Mrs Milne and their two daughters.
  - Very cold day., and some snow at Doongalla. I worked at the steps until noon but the afternoonbeing wet I trimmed a level to the sledge runners in the cart shed also some timber to be used in making the steps. My cough very trying.
  - & At Doongalla. I finished the steps and began to put in, posts for a hand rail. Herrible weather & my cough a nusiance.
  - At Doongalla. I finished the hand rail and cleaned up by noon. In afternoon between the showers I began digging the flower beds at the north end of the terrace's begin-ning on the next one to the drive. Terribly cold with hail rain & snow. In afternoon Fred & his father & I spent some time on the road cleaning out water-table and searching on old road for rubble for metal.
  - At Doongalla. Finished the sledge early and resumed work digging in the beds at north end of the terraces. Cold miserable weather. Colds are getting a little better.

  - At Doongalla. A beautiful day. Fred S. & I spent the day setting poison for rabbits on the mountain boundary. Nellie's father came and took Nellie & baby with Ethel to Aunt. Lillies for a drive.
  - At Doongalla. Working in the K tchen garden. At home in the afternoon. Getting wood & gardening. Expecting some medicine at the store. Lucy, Eric & I went up to a Patriotic Concert at night.
  - Children went to B.S. I felt too ill with my cold to go anywhere. Nellie went to night meeting.
  - 7 At Doongalla. Digging and planting Astor plants on the bank of little creek.
  - At Doongalla. Wrked for half-a-day in the kitchen garden. Had a half holiday then as Miss. Box was married to-day to W.Bond. Did some gardening in the afternoon putting in some more maize.
  - 9 At Doongalla. Digging and hoeing in kitchen garden.

At Doongalla. Working at the cricket pitch. Wellie took Wreven to the dector to the decto

At Doongalla. Working at the cricket pitch. Nellie took Trevor to the doctor to-day as he had had a very bad night. The Doctor says that it was Bronchitis. I met Nellie at Willies and helped her home. Trevor much better at the moment.

- At Doongalla. At the cricket pitch. Picked Codlan Mothed apples at home in the after-noon. Trevor improving slowly.
- Children went to B.S. After church we all went from there to Mr. Langley's for them afternoon. Came home after tea.
- At Doongalla. Grand rain fell in the forence. Fred. S. & I ground tools during the rain. In afternoon continued grubbing stumps on the cricket pitch site. At night I went to Mr. H. Chandler's and was driven by him to his brother's, a J.P who witnessed our signatures with others, to a church land transfer. Very heavy rain fell most of the time. Got home about 10-30.
- At Doongalla. Grubbing for the cricket pitch. In the afternoon Nellie's father came & spent the night with us.
- /6 At Doongalla. Grubbing stumps on the cricket pitch site.
- At Doongalla. Working at the grubbing. Started to form the cricket pitch. Four German warships bombqrding Scarborough &nHartlepool on English coast.

- At Doongalla. A KKAKNX beautiful day. Working on the Birthday track. Finished the section south of the creek and started on the north side. Miss. Jessie Lisson called
  today with Mr. G. Richards.
